The 29th Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (COP29)

The 29th Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (COP29) was held in Baku, the capital of Azerbaijan, located on the Caspian Sea, from Monday, Nov. 11 to Friday, Nov. 22, 2024. COPs take place every year and are the world's only multilateral decision-making forum on climate change that brings together almost every country on Earth. At COP29, various agreements were reached under the chairmanship of H.E. Mukhtar Babayev, Minister of Environment and Natural Resources of the Republic of Azerbaijan, with the priority theme of securing new goals on climate finance.

Blue Zone: A conference and negotiation space managed by the UNFCCC that also utilizes the parking lots around the venue. All official meetings, conferences, side events, and press conferences were held in the Blue Zone during the COP. Only participants accredited by the UNFCCC (delegations of parties, heads of state, accredited observers, accredited press) were allowed to enter the Blue Zone.

Green Zone: A hub operated by the COP29 Presidency for discussions and demonstrations of innovations and solutions to climate change, was opened to a diverse range of stakeholders, including the general public, private sector, media, and Blue Zone exhibitors.

COP29 Japan Pavilion hosted by Ministry of the Environment ~Solutions to the world~

Every year, the Ministry of the Environment sets up a "Japan Pavilion" in the Blue Zone, the official venue for the COP, showcasing Japan's latest initiatives and countermeasures for climate change to the world. At COP29, under the theme of "Solutions to the World", seminars and on-site exhibits were held by government agencies and private sectors to disseminate Japan's policies and latest technologies for climate change, with the aim of achieving the goals of the Paris Agreement.








